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Form of manuscript. Manuscripts should be typed on bond paper (8½ by 11 inches). All parts of the manuscript should be typed double-space or, preferably, triple-space, with margins of at least 1½ inches at the top, bottom, and both sides of each page. Most manuscripts can and should be divided into the following sections: Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgments, and Literature Cited. Only one weight of heading (paragraph lead-in) should be used within each section.

Abstract. An Abstract appears at the beginning of each paper in the *Journal*. The Abstract should not exceed 250 words.

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Nomenclature of viruses. Viruses named after a disease should be written as separate words in lower-case roman, except when the name of the disease is derived from a proper noun: herpes simplex virus, measles virus, Newcastle disease virus, poliomyelitis virus, varicella-zoster virus, vaccinia virus.

Most other viruses should be written as a single word in lower case: adenovirus, coxsackievirus, cytomegalovirus, echovirus, herpesvirus, mengovirus, picornavirus, poliovirus, poxvirus.

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
